**CALL for Research Chapters for the edition
of a digital book on the topic:**

Living and working in cities with a hydrocarbon industry

The production, process and distribution of the hydrocarbon industry influences the social, economic and environmental spaces where it resides. The book seeks to record the social, economic, and environmental processes that have occurred in cities or towns with work centers that are linked to the hydrocarbon industry in Mexico and Latin America. Adding to this dynamic is the current emergency context produced by COVID-19, which has impacted oil demand, its price drop and, therefore, the reduction in its production, changes in the labor dynamics, gender inequality that translates into employment inequality, among others. These conditions lead us to reflect on how the dynamics inside and outside the hydrocarbon industry affect or modify the socio-environmental surrounding of the cities in which it is established.

With the purpose of knowing and reflecting over “Living and working in cities with a hydrocarbon industry”, the authors of the selected chapters will participate in a seminar in which they will present the content of their proposals: research question, methodology, data, and analysis. Each presentation will be organized by theme and will have specialist intervention, with the intention of contributing to the discussion of the authors.

Bases

1. Unpublished research works (in Spanish, Portuguese and English) that address topics related to:
 - a. Family life in oil cities.
 - b. Public spaces in cities or with the presence of the hydrocarbon industry.
 - c. The labor dynamics and COVID-19 effects.
 - d. Labor market in cities with a hydrocarbon industry.
 - e. Risk and occupational / population health.
 - f. History of cities with an oil presence.
 - g. City environmental impact of the hydrocarbon industry.
2. Interested parties/participants will send an abstract with 600 words before January 2, 2022 including: 1) preliminary title of the chapter; 2) topic of interest; 3) abstract; 4) three keywords and 5) author information (name of authors, academic degree, nationality and institutional affiliation) to the ECOSUR platform
